The stories on their latest album 'Sex and the End of It', their first American release (on the Somnimage label) are about sex. No: about the end (double meaning) of sex. Their next album will be about drugs and an album about rock'n'roll will make the holy trinity complete. Before recording for Somnimage, Trespassers W appeared on British (Dead Man's Curve), German (AMF, Pink Lemon), French (Organic), Italian (Snowdonia) and Dutch labels (TW-records, ADM). In many countries, all over the world, the band has a cult-following. Well-known rock-critics such as Andrea 'Ental, Fred Mills, Michael Mahan, Joe Carducci (all four USA), David Stubbs, Paul Rickets (both UK), Diedrich Diederichsen, Martin Büsser (both Germany), Dirk Steenhaut (Belgium) and Stan Rijven (Holland) have sung their praises about the band. What they like about Trespassers W? Their strangeness, their drive, their mystery, their trespassing, their secrets.
